Annual General Meeting ~ 5th September



The Annual General Meetings (AGM) will be held on the 5th September 2012 at the Barr Oval Complex, Beerburrum Road, Caboolture, commencing at 7:30pm. Members are encouraged to support their club by attending the meeting. As per normal, all positions will be declared vacant and nominations will be sought to fill these positions.

These positions are:

- **President:** The President is responsible for fulfilling the Club Mission by leading the Club Executive Committee and ensuring that the Club Objectives are met.
- **Vice President:** The Vice-President is responsible for assisting the President to fulfill the Club Mission and other activities of the Club as directed by the President.
- **Secretary:** The Secretary is responsible for initiating, recording and maintaining the Club hardcopy records including, minutes and correspondence.
- **Treasurer:** The Treasurer is responsible for the collection, custody and payment of all Club accounts, and for the correct maintenance, recording and reporting of the details of these activities and transactions.
- **Runs Coordinator:** The Runs Coordinator has overall responsibility for all Club runs, and in particular, the development of an advance club runs calendar.
- **Membership Officer:** The Membership Officer has overall responsibility for the maintenance of the Club membership records, and the administration of membership-related tasks.
- **Club Dating Officer (Special Interest Vehicle Scheme):** The Club Dating Officer (Club Registration Officer) is responsible inspecting vehicles to ensure that they comply and meet the requirements of the Department of Transport and Main Roads to be eligible for registration as 'Special Interest Vehicles'. The Club Dating Officer must maintain a register of Club special interest vehicles and ensure that the Club obligations of holders of such vehicle registrations are fulfilled in accordance with Club rules.
- **Queensland Historic Motoring Council Representative:** The Queensland Historic Motoring Council Representative is responsible for attending the monthly council meetings by representing the Caboolture Regional Car Club.
- **Swap Meet Officer:** The Swap Meet Officer is responsible for coordinating the Club's yearly swap meet and liaising with relevant authorities.
- **Show 'N Shine Coordinator:** The Show 'N Shine Coordinator is responsible for coordinating the Club's yearly Show 'N Shine which includes the procurement of trophies and gathering of sponsorship and liaising with relevant authorities.
- **Barr Oval Delegate:** The Barr Oval Delegate is responsible for attending meetings of the Barr Oval Committee by representing the Caboolture Regional Car Club.
- **Newsletter Editor:** The Newsletter Editor is responsible for the compilation and distribution of the monthly newsletter to financial members.
- **Webmaster:** The webmaster is responsible for the electronic communications of the Club, and in particular, the development and maintenance of the Club's web-site.



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Special Interest Vehicle (SIV) Registration

Some facts about SIV rego; also known as 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego'. To qualify for club registration, new members must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings within the first six (6) months of membership. Thereafter members holding concessional registration must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings each year in order to retain the concessional registration. Failure to comply may result in forfeiture of the registration. Please refer to Para 5 (4) of the Caboolture Regional Car Club Constitution.



Registering your historic vehicle under the Special Interest Vehicle Scheme, you will need to follow the standard registration procedures for a vehicle as well as completing a Vehicle Registration Concession Application (form F3937) and providing the following documents as proof of eligibility:

- **Club Membership:** Evidence of current membership with an incorporated car club or association must be provided at the time of application for the concession. Where a genuine reason is provided for not meeting this requirement, it may be waived by Queensland Transport.
- **Dating Certificate:** A dating officer (or club official) of an incorporated car club or association must inspect the vehicle to certify that it was manufactured at least 30 years prior. This certificate which must be on club letterhead or other official club documentation must identify the vehicle and the year of manufacture.

Restricted Vehicle Use: Vehicles registered under the SIV scheme have certain limitations placed on their use. This is reflected in the reduced fees and compulsory third party insurance premium. Registered operators must confine their vehicle's use to:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated car clubs.
- Participating in processions for which a Special Events Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Ceremonial purposes (weddings, formals) involving immediate family members only and provided this is **not** done for a fee or for a reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but **not** extended family relationships such as cousins, nephews and nieces or friends.
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. There is no distance restriction in these circumstances however such travel must be reasonable and openly justified by the vehicle operator.
- Road testing within a 15 kilometer radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged. The purpose of the travel must be to road test the vehicle following repair or restoration and not for any other purpose. This does not include use as a means of transport.

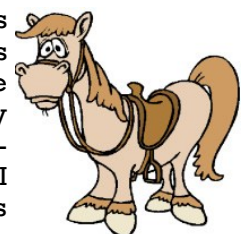

QHMC Rally in NQ: The QHMC requests clubs based north of the tropic to consider hosting a QHMC rally each year.

Conditions to be the same as the current rally. QHMC contribution to this rally is currently at \$1000.

This could be held in addition to existing rallies or in conjunction with a rally already planned for that time.

SIVs. A SIVs working group has been formed and they are researching the terms and conditions of all state concessional registration schemes. This report is being created by noting the official rules and then speaking to members in various states to obtain an insight into the actual working of each scheme. Once completed the federation and the state councils will be in an informed position and can act early if uniform national regulations are proposed. Each member club will receive a copy of the report.

Club Logos for the pending new QHMC website: The QHMC webmaster is developing a new QHMC website. It is requested that clubs supply a JPG file format version of their club logo which will be used in the banner of the new site. Please send the logo to president@qhmc.org.au

SIV dating certificate: Any club having difficulty with the new SIV dating certificate is asked to send their club logo to the QHMC President, president@qhmc.org.au who will set up their form with club logo and name.

In addition there have been a number of inquiries over the use of the dating certificate. This form does not exempt anyone from the normal registration requirements. It is solely a form for the dating officer to confirm that the vehicle meets the historic criteria of their particular club and as such is eligible for concessional registration. If the club guidelines allow modifications then these must be accepted by Queensland Transport, ie Blue Plates if needed, before registration of any kind can be granted. Remember, changing the engine or driveline to a later make or even just a later model could move the vehicle more towards Hot Rod or Street Machine specifications and therefore different rules.

The form is made up of two pages; the second is designed to be retained by the club.

Seat Belts and Child Restraints: As negotiations with Queensland Transport have reached an impasse, a letter has been sent direct to the Minister for Transport. Any member of any club with strong feelings on this issue is asked to approach their local state member to bring your objection to their notice.

Discounted Rego for Veterans: QHMC continues to develop a discounted registration proposal for Veteran vehicles.

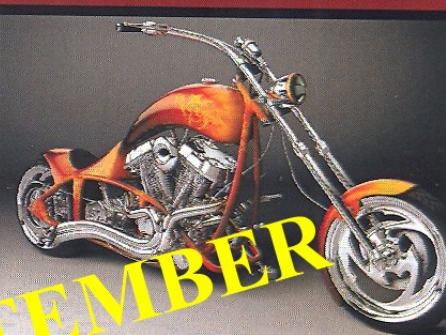

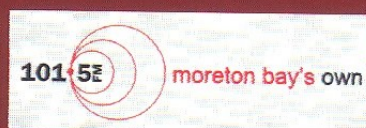
