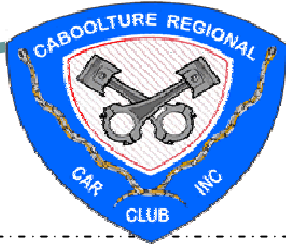

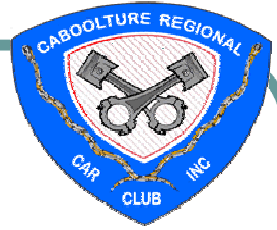

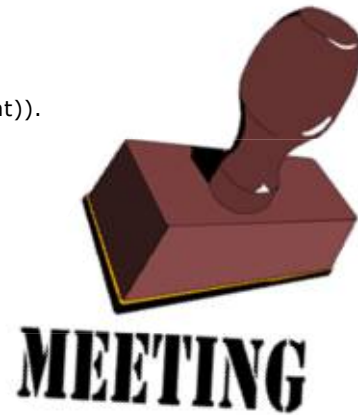

I hate to wave the Torana banner yet again, but as I get nil inputs to the newsletter, people should hardly complain! Like always, Toranafest 2012, held on Sunday 16 September, was a superb event. Organised by the Hunter Valley Torana Club and held on the picturesque Newcastle foreshore, it drew close to 300 entrants from mostly New South Wales and the ACT. However, there were also entrants from Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania and SA. I have been attending this event for the past 15 years and have watched it grow from just 30 or so cars to its current level of nearly 300. Initially I attended as a member of the Sydney Torana Club, then the New South Wales Torana Club, and since moving to Queensland in 2002 and still remaining a member of the New South Wales Torana Club, I also joined the Queensland Torana Car Club and the GTR and XU-1 Club of Queensland.

Being a member several clubs, and to be fair, I generally rotate and park my trusty steel steed with a different club each year at Toranafest. Last year it was with the New South Wales Torana Club, and this year, with the Queensland Torana Car Club. At next year's Toranafest, I intend to wave the CRCC banner for the first time and will probably do so on my own. Without doubt CRCC will likely be the Club with the least cars and therefore it's going to be difficult to get the best club display, but I will give it a go!

Most interstate entrants start arriving at their accommodation in Raymond Terrace on the Friday before Toranafest. The motel in question is the Motto Farm which has 80 ground-level rooms and is spread over 10 acres. This makes an ideal abode for entrants which also provides excellent parking and has a 24-hour diner. A Toranafest sponsor provides free 24-hour active security which gives owners a guarantee that their valuable cars are safe.

Although Toranafest is held on the Sunday, there are Saturday activities such as a 'Torana' cruise through Newcastle which draws about 200 cars, then a humongous BBQ at the motel Saturday evening ending in some form of entertainment. Sunday, it's an early rise for the 25km drive to 'The Foreshore' and to set-up. Following the car show, those remaining at Motto Farm head into Raymond Terrace for a pub meal and a pint or two.

Toranafest usually attracts racing legends like Harry Firth (now in his 94th year), Bob Morris, Colin Bond, Joe Felice, Bev and Phil Brock, Ian Tate, Bob Skelton as well as others. It's a great weekend, and for me, an enjoyable reunion with the many interstate Torana owners I have gotten to know over the many years.

This year I chose to drive to the event on my own (not with the Queensland Torana Club as I generally do) taking the Pacific Highway southbound and the New England highway homebound. I enjoyed the journey with the car performing faultlessly as it always does. No police, no tickets, no hassles. *Sance.*

Interested in buying a Club flag?

After displaying the new Club flag at the last meeting, there has been some interest by members to purchase a flag of their own as a souvenir item. The flag in question is a full-size (1800mm X 900mm) is of good quality and designed specifically for flying from a pole. Alternatively, Flagworld could also offer as another option, a smaller 900mm x 450mm flag with no header, just hemmed (these could be framed) at \$56.00 each plus GST.
