

Minutes of the General Meeting of 3rd April 2013

5. <u>Moved Liz Harris seconded Lance Haslewood that the minutes of the general meeting of</u> Wednesday 3rd April 2013 as published in the April Newsletter be accepted as true and accurate record of the meeting.

Business Arising from the Previous Minutes

6. <u>Donation to 'Friends of the Street'</u>. This item is to ratify a donation of \$2,500.00 made to the 'Friends of the Street' charity details of which was omitted from the April Minutes. SIV Support to Schools, Charities and the Community – Policy Guidance

BACKGROUND

Over the last several years, Queensland Historic Motoring Council (QHMC) has been approached by affiliated clubs for interpretation of the Special Interest Vehicle registration (SIV) arrangements guidelines in relation to the use of SIV-registered vehicles in support of schools conducting formals and similar events. Recently, a couple of our clubs bypassed the QHMC committee and sought their own guidance direct from DTMR. The results have been less than encouraging to those clubs.

INTERPRETATION AND CLARIFICATION OF EXISTING GUIDELINES

QHMC consulted DTMR at its quarterly liaison meeting and came away with an agreed interpretation as explained below relating to SIV Support to Schools, Charities and the Community – non relative (does not alter the existing SIV guideline in relation to ceremonies for immediate family). Clubs and members must abide by the following detailed guidelines to SIV Support to Schools and

Charities:

- Event must be recorded and promoted through the car club newsletter.
- No direct payment to the SIVS vehicle owner is permitted (donations may be made to a charity nominated in the event flyer, newsletter listing).
- Event must commence from a common point; no door to door service.
- Event must terminate at a common point, e.g. at the venue.
- Display vehicles at the termination point, and
- Charity collection at the car display or termination point (charity must be a recognised charity; and event coordinator or designated person must have authorisation from the relevant charity to act as a fundraiser at this event).

The above requirements are not new, they are simply an extrapolation of the existing published SIV guidelines resulting in an approved interpretation for your club's use. They are very close to the guidance provided by the QHMC Executive to one of our country clubs back in 2010 – further reason that QHMC has to be the first point of contact for consistent and accurate interpretation of guidelines.



Remember that in November 2012 Queensland adopted the long-anticipated National Code or Practice (NCOP) for Vehicle Modifications with some parts amended to suit Queensland requirements. Essentially though, this is the same Code of Practice used in other states.

The NCOP has been running concurrently with the Code of Practice for Light Vehicle Modifications since then however as at 30 April 2013 the NCOP will be the only Code of Practice used in Queensland. Many of our cars may have been modified under the outgoing Code of Practice. Is your car legal?

To qualify for 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego' registration, new members must attend four (4) Clubsanctioned activities or Club meetings within the first six (6) months of membership. Thereafter new and present members holding concessional registration must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings each year in order to retain the concessional registration. Failure to comply may result in a recommendation to the Department of Transport and Main Roads for forfeiture of the registration.

Some facts for Special Vehicle Registration:

Registering your vehicle under the Special Interest Vehicle Registration Concession Scheme:

Historic Vehicles

You will need to follow the standard registration procedures for a vehicle as well as completing a Vehicle Registration Concession Application (form F3937) and providing the following documents as proof of eligibility:

<u>Club Membership</u>: Evidence of current membership with an incorporated vehicle club or association must be provided at the time of application for the concession.

<u>Historic Vehicle and Dating Certificate:</u> A dating officer (or club official) of an incorporated vehicle club or association must inspect the vehicle to certify the vehicle's authenticity and year of manufacture, that is, no structural modifications have been made that would deem it as manufactured at the date it was modified. This certificate must be on club letterhead or other official club documentation and include the chassis number or vehicle identification number.

Vehicles fitted with a modification plate, code LH10 are not eligible for a special interest vehicle concession.

Vehicles registered under the scheme have certain limitations placed on their use. This is reflected in the reduced fees and compulsory third party insurance premium. Registered operators must confine their vehicle's use to:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated vehicle clubs.
- Participating in processions for which a Special Events Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management –Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Ceremonial purposes (weddings, formals) involving immediate family members provided this is not done for fee or reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but not extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces.
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Direct travel to and from an Approved Inspection Station (AIS) for the purposes of obtaining a safety certificate before offering the vehicle for sale.
- Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. There is no distance restriction in these circumstances however, such travel must be reasonable and justifiable by the vehicle operator.
- Road testing within a 15 kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged. The purpose of the travel must be to road test the vehicle following repair or restoration and not for any other purpose. This does not include use as a means of transport.

Failure to comply with the conditions of the special interest vehicle scheme is an offence and serious consequences may result.
