From a show 'n shine point-of-view, the number of show vehicles initially seemed down on numbers compared to last year and it was felt that the inclement weather may have been a contributing factor, but by 10:00am, the showground was filling fast.

The quality of vehicles on display was of a very high quality and varied. Some quite surprised owners were called-forward to receive awards from President Dennis Seidel, and congratulations to all particularly the overall winner with his Chevy Chevelle.



At the conclusion of his address, Mr McLean presented the Club with a certificate of appreciation.

10. The A/Secretary presented the inwards and outwards correspondence for the month of June 2013.  $\underline{\text{Moved}}$  Lance Haslewood and  $\underline{\text{seconded}}$  John Larkin that the inwards correspondence be endorsed.

#### Treasurer's Financial Balance of Account

11. The Treasurer presented the financial statement for the month of June 2013. Moved Col Jurkiewicz and seconded Lloyd Thies that the statement as presented be accepted and that the monthly accounts be accepted for payment.

#### **General Business**

#### Swap Meet and Show 'N Shine, 22 June

- 12. Cathy thanked everybody who gave their time to assist with both the show 'n shine and the swap meet, particularly during the set-up on the Friday afternoon when the weather was far from predictable. It had rained during the week and it continued through until early Friday afternoon. Cathy said that the event worked well but some refinements were needed. The following issues were discussed:
  - a. <u>Telephone Traffic.</u> Cassandra Brown said that she was inundated with phone calls prior to the event, some of which were considered unnecessary. She suggested that perhaps the implementation of a recorded message might shed some of the load. Kev suggested a dedicated person who could afford the time be delegated the task of taking phone calls.
  - b. <u>Funds Control.</u> Bob Farmer raised concerns at the high denominations in currency presented by vendors/visitors at the gates which put a considerable strain on the float. He said that some people arrived cashless with the intent of using the onsite ATM. Those who Bob had let through to use the ATM did not return to pay for their entrance or site fees.
  - c. <u>Entrance Fee.</u> Shane Tittor recommended that the entrance fee be increased from \$4.00 to \$5.00 per person as this would aid in better funds management at the gates.
  - d. <u>Show 'N Shine Entrants.</u> Kevin Lewis informed that there were 186 entrants in the show 'n shine. A further 30 chose not to be judged.
  - e. <u>Gate Entry.</u> Cassandra Brown was unable to open her gate with the key provided and suggested that all gates have the one key format.
  - f. Removal of Purchased Goods from Swap Meet Site. Car Talboys recommended that the Club acquire trolleys to assist people in removing their purchased goods from the swap meet site.
  - g. <u>Incidents.</u> Cathy advised of two incidents which caused some concern. These were:
    - i <u>Use of Facilities by Club.</u> A member of the 'Bird Association' was upset that a vendor was using the bird shed thereby voiding him assess to it. Situation resolved.
    - ii. <u>Vehicle Movement on Grounds.</u> It was reported that a vehicle 'hastily' left the grounds without authority at 12:30 pm. The complainant was quite vocal on the matter claiming that the vehicle left the grounds without authority. The complainant was not a member of the Club or the Show Society. As a result of this matter, and other matters at the previous event, Cathy suggested that the Club should raise the issue with the Show Society. This was agreed.

**For Action:** Cathy to liaise with the Show Society to set-up a meeting with the Club executive committee.

- h. <u>Printing of Event Flyers.</u> Cathy acknowledged the support provided by Brian Bates (Caboolture Bowl) for sponsoring the printing of event flyers and other material. Brian has unselfishly and generously provided this support for previous show 'n shine and swap meet events as well a for the monthly Club newsletter. Cathy asked for an acknowledgement of appreciation on behalf of the Club.
- i. <u>SES Support.</u> As an acknowledgement of the excellent support provided by the Caboolture SES who tirelessly gave their time in performing a multitude of roles, Cathy proposed that the Club donate a sum of \$1500 to the SES to be shared with their Woodford colleagues. Seconded Jason Brown.

Carried.

j. <u>Support from Myra Thompson.</u> Myra, a participant in the yearly 'Ride for Cancer' event and a recipient of a past donation from the Club, kindly assisted in several roles during the event. Cathy proposed that the Club donate a sum of money towards Myra's next Ride for Cancer. It was agreed that an amount of \$500 be presented to Myra for Ride for Cancer. <u>Seconded Carl Talboys.</u>





Assembled in Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada, Bricklin's initial intent was to sell the cars for \$4000. That price went to \$6500, then to \$7400 by the time the first 1974 model was actually bought. The 1975 model skyrocketed to \$9980.

One feature of the Bricklin was that it didn't include an ashtray or lighter, and this was to discourage smoking. Despite its gutbusting, 100lb (40.5kg) gullwing doors, the SV1 was supposed to exemplify the safer car of the future; the name stands for "Safety Vehicle 1." The bodies were made of brightly coloured, dent-resistant plastic, like playschool furniture. All those resin panels and compressible bumpers added hundreds of pounds that the emissions-limited V8s couldn't handle.
