AGM ~ 04 September



Number plates used to track drivers

POLICE can capture the whereabouts of any vehicle on Queensland roads at any time and will use the information to charge criminals.

The location of 25,000 registered number plates are being stored by police each week under a trial that has alarms civil libertarians.

The move is part of a Broadened Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) trial which uses GPS systems and cameras fitted in police vehicles. It means that if a motorist drives past a police vehicle, their position is recorded. The information will be stored for one year and one day. The trial will end in June 2014.

While police are using the information to find unregistered vehicles, sources admit it could also be used to record motorists near crime scenes.

"If a request is made by a police officer for a search of the ANPR database to be conducted and the request is substantiated and approved by a commissioned officer as supporting the investigation or prosecution of a criminal offence, the recorded ANPR information can be lawfully used by the Queensland Police Service", police said in a statement.

The Queensland Police Service has

strict accountability measures in place where tracing the movements of thousands of Queenslanders through their mobile records.

Even the phone records of their own officers were being pulled to determine if they had faked sickies, had had sex with cadets at the academy or bunked-off while on duty.

Queensland council for Civil Liberties president Andrew Sinclair said the trial was concerning. "At least there is an act governing the telcos (when police ask them for information) but there's nothing governing how they collect and use the numberplates." Mr Sinclair said. "And I bet it ends-up getting used for all sorts of things."

Queensland Police Privacyt Commissioner Lemm Ex said his office had been appraised for the trial. "Number plates are not themselves personal information," Mr Ex said.

"The significant factor is not the capture of number plates but their recognition and the linking with an individual. If that linking is conducted for law enforcement activities, no privacy issues arise with it." Queensland Police Service has trialled the technology previously.

A British survey, which found that one in six drivers admitted to plotted paybacks, suggests revenge rage is no less dangerous than road rage. It seems that these drivers admit to being inwardly furious, and brooding long and hard about motoring incidents.

he sign states: 'Keep Left Unless Overtaking'. It's a simple instruction which should be easy to abide by. So why do many drivers struggle with the concept?

Keeping to the left on multi-lane roads is the safe and sensible thing to do because it means that all overtaking is done on the right. The laws of some states prohibit overtaking in the left lane and drivers can be fined if caught doing it.

This doesn't apply only on motorways, it also makes sense in suburban arterial roads, except, perhaps when traffic is heavy.

Keeping to the left at all times is recommended by traffic authorities on multi-lane roads, not just motorways. When the speed limit is higher than 80km/h, it is no longer a recommendation, it is compulsory.

There are seldom any problems if there are two lanes on motorways.

The majority of drivers do the right thing and use the left lane, but give them three lanes, and it all goes out the window with a surprising number of drivers ignoring the left lane altogether and cruising in the centre lane. This means that the driver doing the right thing and travelling in the left lane has to change lanes no fewer than four times to safely overtake a vehicle on his right-hand side.

This just doesn't make sense and can lead to the constant weaving in-and-out of traffic so hair-raising at times.

The slower drivers often blame the faster ones for this excessive lane changes, however the fault frequently lies with the one in the slow car who is in the wrong lane. The fault also lies with the drivers driving under the speed limit.

I drive the D'Aguilar Highway between Caboolture and D'Aguilar regularly. At the bottom of the D'Aguilar Range there is a humongous sign which reads 'Keep Left Unless Overtaking', yet inconsiderate drivers regularly sit in the right-hand lane, many travelling at below the 90kmh speed limit thereby effectively blocking any chance of faster cars from overtaking. Then there is the other extreme

where drivers, once commencing the climb up the range, think they are on pit straight at Bathurst, all the while, remaining in the right-hand lane.

So, please 'Keep Left Unless Overtaking'.



Special Interest Vehicle Registration (SIV) ~ 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego'

To qualify for 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego' registration, new members must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings within the first six (6) months of membership. Thereafter new and present members holding concessional registration must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings each year in order to retain the concessional registration. Failure to comply may result in a recommendation to the Department of Transport and Main Roads for forfeiture of the registration.

Some facts for Special Vehicle Registration:

Registering your vehicle under the Special Interest Vehicle Registration Concession Scheme:

Historic Vehicles

You will need to follow the standard registration procedures for a vehicle as well as completing a Vehicle Registration Concession Application (form F3937) and providing the following documents as proof of eligibility:

<u>Club Membership</u>: Evidence of current membership with an incorporated vehicle club or association must be provided at the time of application for the concession.

<u>Historic Vehicle and Dating Certificate:</u> A dating officer (or club official) of an incorporated vehicle club or association must inspect the vehicle to certify the vehicle's authenticity and year of manufacture, that is, no structural modifications have been made that would deem it as manufactured at the date it was modified. This certificate must be on club letterhead or other official club documentation and include the chassis number or vehicle identification number.

Vehicles fitted with a modification plate, code LH10 are not eligible for a special interest vehicle concession.

Vehicles registered under the scheme have certain limitations placed on their use. This is reflected in the reduced fees and compulsory third party insurance premium. Registered operators must confine their vehicle's use to:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated vehicle clubs.
- Participating in processions for which a Special Events Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management –Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Ceremonial purposes (weddings, formals) involving immediate family members provided this is not done for fee or reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but not extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces.
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Direct travel to and from an Approved Inspection Station (AIS) for the purposes of obtaining a safety certificate before offering the vehicle for sale.
