Welcome to July 2014 Newsletter.

2014 marks the 20th anniversary of the formation of the Caboolture Regional Car Club. The inaugural meeting was held at McDonalds, Strathpine on the 9th March 1994 and was attended by Darryl Norris, Teena and Geoff Fritz, Jim and Kris Mozok, John Fenech, Neville Layt, Narelle Norris, Paul and Kym Byrne and Vic and Lyn Assenbruck. The Club was formed when a number of people separated from the Brisbane Early Holden Car Club and formed the Caboolture Regional Holden Car Club. Sometime later, the club was renamed the Caboolture Regional Car Club which opened it to all makes of cars irrespective of age or type.

To commemorate the Club's 20th anniversary, a commemorative patch has been designed which will be embroidered and made available to all financial members.



Membership Fees: Just a reminder that membership fees are overdue as of 30th June. Current fees are at \$20.00 per single member and \$30.00 per couple. Current SIV Policy Remains. At the MOCC (Motoring Organisation Car Club) meeting on Wednesday 17 June TMR (Transport and Main Roads) advised that a decision had been made by Government on the status of the SIVS (Special Interest Vehicle Scheme).

Consideration was made with the following options:

1. Retain the current scheme.

Enhance the current scheme with an optional extra cost log book scheme for 14 days additional use
 Replace the current scheme completely with a log book scheme.

TMR's decision is to retain the current SIV scheme in it's current form.

This decision was based on the following:

1. Cost to develop and implement a new or modified scheme in the current economic climate was prohibitive.

2. Results of surveys through the MOCC member groups indicated that the majority of members wished to retain the current scheme and no extra costs.

3. TMR's reluctance to lumber member clubs with extra costs and administration of a log book scheme.

TMR thanked the groups for the response and advised that whilst the current SIVS scheme will remain at present that they may revisit the situation in the future when the budget and registration system modifications make the possibility more feasible.




Joke for the month.....

Special Interest Vehicle Registration (SIV) ~ 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego'

To qualify for 'Concessional' or 'Club Rego' registration, new members must attend four (4) Clubsanctioned activities or Club meetings within the first six (6) months of membership. Thereafter new and present members holding concessional registration must attend four (4) Club-sanctioned activities or Club meetings each year in order to retain the concessional registration. Failure to comply may result in a recommendation to the Department of Transport and Main Roads for forfeiture of the registration.

Some facts for Special Vehicle Registration:

Registering your vehicle under the Special Interest Vehicle Registration Concession Scheme:

Historic Vehicles

You will need to follow the standard registration procedures for a vehicle as well as completing a Vehicle Registration Concession Application (form F3937) and providing the following documents as proof of eligibility:

<u>Club Membership</u>: Evidence of current membership with an incorporated vehicle club or association must be provided at the time of application for the concession.

<u>Historic Vehicle and Dating Certificate:</u> A dating officer (or club official) of an incorporated vehicle club or association must inspect the vehicle to certify the vehicle's authenticity and year of manufacture, that is, no structural modifications have been made that would deem it as manufactured at the date it was modified. This certificate must be on club letterhead or other official club documentation and include the chassis number or vehicle identification number.

Vehicles fitted with a modification plate, code LH10 are not eligible for a special interest vehicle concession.

Vehicles registered under the scheme have certain limitations placed on their use. This is reflected in the reduced fees and compulsory third party insurance premium. Registered operators must confine their vehicle's use to:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated vehicle clubs.
- Participating in processions for which a Special Events Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management –Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Ceremonial purposes (weddings, formals) involving immediate family members provided this is not done for fee or reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but not extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces.
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Direct travel to and from an Approved Inspection Station (AIS) for the purposes of obtaining a safety certificate before offering the vehicle for sale.
- Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. There is no distance restriction in these circumstances however, such travel must be reasonable and justifiable by the vehicle operator.
- Road testing within a 15 kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged. The purpose of the travel must be to road test the vehicle following repair or restoration and not for any other purpose. This does not include use as a means of transport.

Failure to comply with the conditions of the special interest vehicle scheme is an offence and serious consequences may result.
