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Run departure points: BPs North and South or the Big Fish?

Originally, most Club runs departed from the 'Big Fish' complex which is located adjacent the Bruce Highway on Pumicestone Road. The decision to relocate to the BP Service Centres near Burpengary occurred about three years ago and the reason is two-fold in that (1), the closure of Humble Pie at the Big Fish meant no facilities such as toilets or refreshments, and (2), the northbound exit ramp was considered too short and therefore presented a safety hazard when endeavouring to merge with high-speed traffic. But an advantage of the Big Fish was congestion-free parking, and at the time, fuel was available at the adjacent Caltex. This facility no longer exists.

The BP Service Centres has advantages over the Big Fish with its fuel, eateries and clean toilet facilities, however a disadvantage is congestion as often several car clubs and motor-cycle groups meet there, more often at the same time as CRCC members. In addition, the BP Service Centres are a designated interstate trucking and bus stop which adds to the congestion.

Those familiar with the Big Fish area will know that a considerable amount of road work has recently been carried-out on Pumicestrone Road with improvements to allow better traffic flow and exiting onto the Bruce Highway.

Although no move has yet been made to return to the Big Fish, it will be brought-up for discussion within the near future. Please have a think about it and when the time comes, cast an opinion. Essentially it is up to members to make the decision. One suggestion is to use the Big Fish for westbound runs and retain the BPs for all others. Could this be fraught with danger with members possibly turning-up at the wrong departure point?

was lost. The horses escaped but are back on the 21 acres and safe. A motion was put forward by the President that the Club donate \$1000 for one year for care of a horse whose name is 'Prince'. **Seconded** Warren Pavey. All in favour. Carried.

He was resigning from the committee this evening. Nominations were asked for and it was voted on that John Hogg and Claire Strickfuss would take over and share the

- Treasurer position, with John Hogg being the third signatory of the bank account and term deposit. All in favour.
- Run Coordinator 1 and 2. Run Coordinator 2 gave a report as the previous incumbent had resigned and Naosha Chalvatzis agreed to take the position. She reported that a breakfast run to Matthew Thomas Restaurant, Sandgate, would take place on Sunday 31st May, 2015. Meet BP South at 7:00am for a 7:30am departure. Consulting is in progress for a day run on Sunday 12th July, possibly to Gympie. For those who did not attended the 6th May General Meeting, the Club donated \$1000.00 to the Cartmill Centre of Burpengary Riding for the Disabled which was adversely affected by the flooding which occurred on 1st May. Much of the centre was destroyed or needs repairing. Below is a background of what the Centre does and achieves.

THE CARTMILL COMMUNITY CENTRE BURPENGARY RDA

he Cartmill Centre of Burpengary Riding for Disabled Association Incorporated was formed in 1986 by a small group of helpers, who had one horse, four riders and a dream! Their Philosophy was to make the world a better place to live – essentially for people with disabilities.

Over the ensuing years, the Centre has built a large covered arena, quality stables, a tack room, hay shed, clubhouse, office and playground on the Burpengary site with the generous support of local businesses and volunteers. It occupies twenty-one acres along Burpengary Creek with twenty-two horses living here for the riding year. The Centre currently has one hundred and thirty-five riders, five coaches and over one hundred and fifty volunteers. In 2000, it established an Early Intervention Centre at Redcliffe for pre-schoolers.

Cartmill has developed several trails through the bush, as well as an adventure park. To further help the mobility of riders, there is a games program, a playground for children, a 'Liberty Swing' and a 'Tractor Trekker', which have wheelchair access. Courage at the Centre is inspirational.

There are no paid staff and therefore volunteers are the backbone of the Centre. The Centre's five coaches all maintain their accreditation with the Riding for Disabled Australia Association, which is in accordance with the National Coaching Council guidelines.

Over the years, Cartmill has had several events which have impacted greatly on the Centre. In 2007, it were unable to operate for several months due to the Equine Influenza outbreak that affected South East Queensland. There was no rider activity during this time, with very little donations. This made it very hard work for volunteers to maintain the horses and grounds.

In 2009 the Centre suffered a great calamity when a tsunami-like flood hit the facility within minutes. The severe force of the water swept many of the horses away. One horse (Holly), was recovered a couple of kilometres away after being washed under three bridges. The water rose very quickly and receded equally as rapidly, leaving one of horse, (Mr. Magoo), stranded over the grandstand. His injuries were such that he required three months at the Samford Animal Hospital. Both horses are now back 'at work', supporting riders today. Again it was a few months before the program was up-and-running.

In 2011 when all of South East Queensland flooded, the Centre was prepared and had moved all of the horses to high ground. However, the tack room and clubhouse facilities were totally submerged and the entire arena and playground filled was washed away. The floods were so close together (eighteen months), that the Centre suffered significant damage to its saddler, all office equipment, computers, records, etc. Fences were swept away and the Centre's two month-old tractor was totally submerged.

Due to the huge community support received following these natural disasters, there seems to now be a greater awareness of the Centre's work and programs and this has improved interaction between people with disabilities and the broader community. Many Service Clubs generously provide the Centre with invaluable support which enabled it to continued to progress towards a full recovery with very few interruptions to the riding program in 2014. The Centre has been able to resume its carriage driving program, introduce hippotherapy and cement its relationship with the Light Horse and rehabilitation of serving soldiers.
