RUN ETIQUETTE

To ensure that their vehicle has adequate fuel to reach the destination or the next planned fuel stop. Refuelling the vehicle should be done before refuelling oneself! Run departures will not be delayed for those vehicles needing last-minute fuel particularly if there has been an ample opportunity to fill-up before the run departs.

Urged to be on time for the commencement of the run and/or event. Should a member be running late and wishes to commence the run with the group, he/she should contact the run coordinator. Similarly if members wish to join en-route.

Urged to keep together wherever possible, particularly in built-up areas. This will minimise the necessity of continually stopping to regroup which can be hazardous. It is realised that keeping together in built-up areas can be difficult, but often those caught at traffic lights will catch-up to those in front as they themselves are slowed by lights.

Not permitted to overtake the designated run leader. However participants may move about within the group, overtaking when safe and legal.

Encouraged to remain with the group until the agreed dispersal point at the end of the event. This also applies to static events such as car shows.

Encouraged to carry a small portable UHF CB radio and set to Channel 9. Such radios are relatively inexpensive, and have ranges varying from around one to five kilometres. They are invaluable and a medium by which to keep informed about what is going on, and to let the group know if you have become separated or broken-down.



HEN Karen Fiedler's husband Des finished restoring his 1969 Monaro, she asked him where her historic ride was. The Elimbah mother-of-three was looking for a Holden from her era—she was born in 1964—when she found an EH Holden for sale in Gympie.

The owner, an older gentleman, was ill and no longer able to work on the car with his son.

Karen and Des liked what they saw and even though they found out it was in fact a 1963 model, they're happy with the car they bought that day and proud of how it now looks. "It was the fourth EH off the production line in Adelaide. It would be one of the oldest EHs on the road," Karen says.

Des restored the body, sandblasting it back to bare metal, and completely overhauled the

mechanics. Before Des got to work, the car was roadworthy, but "valley mist" green with a brown interior.

"When I first drove it, people didn't give you respect on the road because it didn't look any good. Now that it's done up, you get a lot more respect," Karen says.

They made sure the previous owner could also enjoy the transformation, driving it back to Gympie for the old man to see.

"He drove it in his driveway and told us he'd give us our money back," Karen recalls.

They politely declined and now enjoy driving the car to club events.

"It was the first car I remember my parents

having," she says. "It's the car you remember from when you were young,"

Driving the EH long distances is not without its perils, especially if the fuel level drops below the quarter tank mark.

"You're not an EH owner unless you've run out of fuel," Karen says, laughing.

They'll fill the tank and head to the EJ-EH Nationals at Bathurst in March.

"It's smooth, it's nice to drive, it's nice to sit in, even without airconditioning," she says.

So, how does she feel when she's driving with the wind in her hair? "I feel young. You're back in that same era when you were 16-20 years old," she says.

Karen says car clubs are not just for men and they're a great way to meet people.

The couple are members of the Caboolture Regional Car Club, which has been bringing car lovers together since 1994.


